

## Postgraduate Teaching



- **Graduate Teacher Training Registry** is responsible for postgraduate teaching courses that qualify you for teaching in primary and secondary education.

- £15 application fee
- All applicants are interviewed
- You will be subject to police checks regarding to working with children
- For teaching at FE and HE levels you will need a further level of qualification, though this can currently be undertaken 'on the job'.
  
- Fees up to £3,070 but receive £300 from government towards fees
- Students in Wales can receive up to £1,845 towards fees, plus up to £1,500 means tested sum
- All postgraduate training teachers currently get a bursary of £6,000 (£150 a week over 40 weeks).

### GTP

As an alternative route look into the Graduate Teacher Programme

The Graduate Teacher Programme is on-the-job training allowing graduates to qualify as a teacher while they work. It's a good choice for mature students who want to change to a teaching career but need to continue earning while they train.

To take part in the GTP you can either respond to an advertisement for the GTP programme, apply direct to a GTP provider who will either find you a school, or you will need to find a job in a school to support you through the programme. You will be employed as an unqualified teacher.

Once on the programme your training will be tailored to your own individual needs and lead to qualified teacher status (QTS).
